So there is no guarantee that this list is current or accurate. Whenever possible, you should call ahead of time to make sure they are still serving.

1. Every Sunday morning at 8:00 am, Dream Center of Las Vegas-located at 911 North G Street, near Washington, has a free pastries, and bread give-away. (702) 636-0351
